

Thank you for worshipping God with Trinity Lutheran today! Blessings to you and your family. Today is the eighth Sunday of the Pentecost season! This season recognizes "the everyday life" of the Church and the Christian. It contains approximately 25 Sundays. The liturgical color of the Trinity season is green. Green symbolizes hope and growth.

#### A few notes on the service today—

- Today's texts offer instruction and encouragement for all who are occasionally overwhelmed by the "unhappy business" of life. Jesus urges us to take care and be on guard against all kinds of greed. We who have died with Christ in holy baptism have also been raised with him and are encouraged to elevate our thinking, seeking the "things that are above." To that end we seek the sustenance of the Lord's supper and the encouragement of God's word.
- Most of the service is printed in your bulletin. Please participate as you are able. The **bold** print within this bulletin indicates "all read". This bulletin is produced in fairly large print so all can participant fully.
- Asterisk (\*) indicates all stand if you are comfortable participating in this way. You are welcome to be seated for the entire service, or to stand for select opportunities as marked with the asterisk.
- Hearing assist devices are available upon request. See the techs in our tech room before service.
- Children of all ages are always welcome to worship with Trinity. There are bulletins for children, too.
- Holy Communion will be celebrated at the altar today. Participation is voluntary. Communion will be distributed by servers at the front. All are invited to come forward at the direction of an usher(s). See an usher after worship for a pre-packaged communion set to take home if you prefer not to take regular communion at the altar. If worshipping online, communing at home, you are invited to participate with a small piece of bread or cracker, and liquid of choice—some form of juice or wine.





#### **RESPONSIVE PSALM 49:1-12**

#### SCRIPTURE READING Colossians 3:1-11

<sup>1</sup>So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. <sup>2</sup>Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, <sup>3</sup>for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. <sup>4</sup>When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

<sup>5</sup>Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). <sup>6</sup>On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. <sup>7</sup>These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. <sup>8</sup>But now you must get rid of all such things—anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. <sup>9</sup>Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices <sup>10</sup>and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. <sup>11</sup>In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all!

#### INVITATION TO COMMUNION

When you gather in Jesus' name, wherever you are, Christ is present. The bread and wine are mysteriously the real presence of Jesus Christ, and we trust that Jesus is really with us in this meal. Martin Luther would say Christ is "in, with, and under" the elements.

Distribution will be at the front this morning. You are invited to come forward at the direction of the usher(s) OR remain seated and open your individual communion package after the Lord's Prayer. If communing in your pew or at home, please wait and commune as Pastor Amy says the words, "The body of Christ, given for you" and "The blood of Christ, shed for you".

#### WORDS OF INSTITUTION

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying:
This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin.
Do this for the remembrance of me.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.



# Listening Circles and Mission Statement Development




